PROVIDER ACCESS STATEMENT



This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and the Baker Clause which is in compliance with the amendment to the Technical & Further Education Act f 2017 which stipulates that: schools must allow colleges and training providers access to every student in years 8 – 13 (Pinewood to Year 11) to discuss non-academic routes that are available to them.
