

Literacy

Pupils will enhance their narrative skills with books like 'How to make friends with a ghost' and 'how to catch a star', while working on newspaper reports through other narratives such as Wolf in the Snow, The True Story of the Three Little Pigs and the Gigantic Turnip.

Daily Phonics lessons will continue to use SMART KIDS The Code scheme. Individual 1:1 reading will also continue. There will be more focus on group guided reading sessions.

Numeracy

We will spend the first half of this term focusing on time and shape. We will also cover multiplicative reasoning, additive reasoning, and number. As well as daily fluency. We will be using some online games to help consolidate and practise key skills as well as looking at problem solving in more depth.

Science

In science pupils will be exploring the properties, uses, and suitability of everyday materials and how their shapes can be changed through manipulation.

Communication

In these lessons we will focus on the pre requisites of communication, responding appropriately and tone of voice, through a range of games.

Geography

Students will study capital cities, settlements, and trade links, comparing London to other global cities, while using maps to explore physical features and landmarks in the UK, Europe, and the Americas.

History

Students will explore the Anglo-Saxons, including their invasions, daily life, beliefs, and key figures like King Alfred the Great.



Fry Class

Spring Curriculum Overview

Theme: Trade, Transport & Technology

Art

Experimenting with colour and tone, including colour wheels and creating models and pictures linked to our theme.

Drama & Music

In music, pupils will study music from movie and film as well as looking at music from around the world. In drama, pupils will explore body language and facial expressions through travel-themed activities.

PSHE & RSE

Students will learn to manage beliefs, challenge discrimination, and develop self-worth, while exploring mental health, wellbeing, and healthy coping strategies.

RE

In Spring, students explore identity, prayer, worship, and reflection, focusing on beliefs, sacred stories, and the role of prayer. They also learn about sources of wisdom, Easter's significance, and how beliefs shape behaviour.

Technology

Fry class are cooking this term. Pupils will develop practical skills, including weighing, mixing and chopping. Recipes will include pizza pinwheels, pancakes, fruit and rice salad.

Intervention Work

Our intervention and social breakfast work is currently focussed around social skills and working as part of a group.

PE

Students will learn table tennis and table cricket skills, including serving, rallying, and team play. They will also practice movement to music, focusing on balance, body tension, and creating sequences with partner balances.
