

Literacy

Pupils will focus on poetry, including free verse and simile.

A narrative study of 'We're Going to Find the Monster!' will follow.

Pupils will write recounts and rules based on 'Boris Goes Camping' and events throughout the academic year.

Numeracy

Pupils will learn to use a range of positional language. We will also learn about patterns and doubling and halving and what the relationship between the numbers is.

We will also be practicing our 1:1 counting and understanding the relationship between numbers, this will include looking at groups and understanding which has more and which has less.

Science

Pupils will explore rocks, their types, uses, and formation, alongside states of matter, changes through heating and cooling, the water cycle, and reversible and irreversible changes.

Communication

In these lessons we will focus on the pre-requisites of communication, responding appropriately and tone of voice, through a range of games.

Geography: Pupils will develop map skills, compass use, and geographical comparisons, focusing on countries, continents, oceans, and human and physical geography.

History: Pupils will study Ancient Egypt's timeline, key figures, culture, religion, and lasting achievements.

RE: We will explore religious beliefs, moral guidance, shared values, and global responsibility.



Curriculum Overview

Summer Theme: Dangerous planet

Wonder Class

Music & Drama

In music, pupils will create soundscapes and a class song based on natural disasters. In drama, pupils will work on stage types & positioning.

Art

Wonder class will be making 3d models of natural (physical) features linked to the dangerous planet theme e.g. a volcano. We will also be exploring textures such as tree bark and colour mixing.

Technology

The students will be doing food tech where they will be cooking items such as breakfast scones, meat free jollof rice, quick bean enchiladas, salmon fish cakes, pork yuk sung and mini fruit cakes.

PSHE & RSE

Pupils will learn about healthy relationships and contraception, online safety, consent, media literacy, financial security, critical thinking and responsible decision-making.

PE

Pupils will develop athletic and rounders skills, covering sprint starts, hurdles, relay changeovers, jumping, discus, and javelin, alongside fielding, batting, and game strategies in rounders.
